Funding Sources

- DEED
- Metropolitan Council
- Hennepin County
- Ramsey County



Eligible Applicants

- Cities, Counties, HRA, EDA or Port Authority
- Funds can (and should be) used for private developments



What else is needed to Qualify?

- An MPCA-approved Response Action Plan
- A resolution of support and sponsorship from the applicant
- A development plan



What Activities are eligible?

- Investigation
- Cleanup
- Sometimes demolition, acquisition or other costs necessary for cleanup



When are the funds available?

May 1 and November 1 of each year



How much is available?

- Investigations are typically capped at \$50,000
- Cleanups range from \$50,000 to over \$1,000,000 -
- Typically average about \$400,000

- Local Assessment Tools




